Autism and ADHD support

National Autistic Society

Large national charity covering all aspects of autism, including co-occurring conditions.

Guide to understanding neurodiversity and neurodivergence, available in multiple languages and speech to text option.

ADHD UK

Extensive information about ADHD, including videos.

Whole family support

Calderdale Branch National Autistic Society

Local youth and family support groups, as well as local information.

Early Help Hub

A variety of community-based services to support families and young people. These include activities, services and groups in the local area.

Healthy Futures School Nursing Team

Supports physical and emotional wellbeing of children and young people. Provides advice on issues including complex needs. The team can also refer to other services.

West Yorkshire ADHD Support Group

Groups, activities and support for children, young people and their families in the local and wider area.

Silvercloud ADHD programmes

Two online programmes, one for those aged 14 and over, and one for families, around living well with ADHD. Suitable for those on a waiting list or diagnosed.

Calderdale Neurodivergent Hub

In-person activities and support services for neurodivergent people aged 16+, with or without diagnosis.

Northpoint's YouTube Channel

A wide assortment of videos and recorded workshops covering in-depth information around neurodivergence, mental wellbeing, and safety advice.



Parent and carer support

<u>Unique Ways</u>

Advice, support groups and practical services for parents/carers of children who are disabled or have additional needs.

Focus4Hope

Runs fortnightly meet up sessions for parental support in Brighouse.

<u>Contact</u>

Advice on benefits, EHCPs and a 'listening ear' service for peer support.

<u>Wayfinder</u>

Stainland-based coffee mornings for family support and sharing of views.

Early years

Locala Health Visiting Team

Support and advice for families of children aged 0-4, via specially qualified nurses and midwives.

Education

Calderdale SENDIASS

Impartial and confidential legal advice for parents of children with SEND around Education, Health and Social Care.

Calderdale Specialist Inclusion Team

SEND professionals who work with those aged 0–19 and their schools/educational placements to ensure needs are met.

<u>IPSEA</u>

SEND law charity providing direct advice to families. Courses, training packages, and a range of free resources including template letters.

Specialist services and advice
